

## TBYC General Policy

Select Policies transcribed from original PDF, without changes, March 2022.

### Waste Disposal

Members shall not spill hazardous materials onto the ground or into the river/lake system. The member shall be responsible for any costs or damage incurred in the clean up of a spill for which they are responsible. Members are responsible for the safe storage and disposal of antifreeze (glycol), batteries, or used fuel from their boats. Persons leaving these on Club property will be charged a fee for disposal.

The blue garbage bin is for the sole disposal of waste created in the maintenance of boats, boat garbage or garbage from the operation of the Clubhouse. No destroyed or waste tarps shall be placed in the bin. No household garbage or waste shall be brought to the Club and disposed of in the container. Persons observed using the bin for household waste shall be charged the dumping fee for emptying the bin.

### Vehicles

The Club assumes no responsibility whatever for loss or damage however caused, to vehicles parked on property owned by The Club. Vehicles shall not be left unattended in areas designated as no parking or where they will impede safe movement of vehicles of equipment.

### Operating a Business

It is understood that operating a charter, rental or any business operation out of the Club facilities on a full-time or part-time basis is not allowed.

### Reciprocal Agreements

As part of the TBYC'S RECIPROCAL AGREEMENT, a Member of a recognized Yacht Club may use the TBYC facilities and services upon approval by a Flag Officer of the Club Executive. The fee for this service shall be set annually by the board.

### Living Aboard

Permanent on-board living is not allowed.
